onto 41 towards Oconto, 3.5 miles past the split turn right on to Huebscher Road (Shell Gas Station), then right onto Deprey.

THIS EVENT: DAYLILY GARDEN TOUR ON 30 JULY 9 AM - 1 PM

Club members and their families and friends have an opportunity to visit two great gardens!!! Zoe and Jim Fameree and Pat and Bob Grathen invite you to see and enjoy their gardens as they do.

Jim and Zoe Fameree (1294 Alice Drive, Green Bay) have resided at their home since 1973 (38 years). During that time their yard and gardens have gone through many changes including 3 additions and totally moving a whole shade garden. Currently, they have 136 daylilies, 93 hostas, a wide diversity of other perennials, some annuals, an assortment of fruit trees including 3 peach trees, and a vegetable garden with a variety of veggies. Although a city-size lot, they take full advantage of every nook and corner to add plants and make it more pleasing to the eye. They also add hanging baskets and pots of annuals to compliment their already colorful yard. Come and see it and enjoy it as they do. They live on the west side of Green Bay: At the intersection of Lombardi Avenue and Military Avenue, turn south on to Marlee Lane (Military Ave becomes Marlee Ln south of Lombardi Ave) then turn right on to Alice Drive!

Bob and Pat Grathan (3908 Double Q Road) took an interest in daylilies in 2008 and have been adding to their collection since then. They reside in a quiet rural setting surrounded by beautiful mature evergreen trees and accented with flower beds that flow around their home. Visitors will be treated to 150 daylilies and other perennials that thrive in the shade and sunny areas. Come see their garden art! They live on the far east side of Green Bay. From Ivy Trail Garden Gifts at 3200 Main Street, follow Hwy 29 East toward Kewaunee for about 2 miles; turn right (south) on to County QQ Road. (B & D Cattle is at this intersection.) Cty QQ is a dead end road. Go 1 mile, follow the curve to the right and the road ends shortly after that. We are the last house on the right up in the woods. You can't miss it!

Bob and Pat and Jim and Zoe have worked many hours to prepare their gardens for your visit. Please visit their gardens and enjoy the fellowship with fellow members in beautiful surroundings.
